Entries not on official AKC agility entry forms or photocopies of entry forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC agility entry form are invalid. Changes, additions, or corrections to entry forms must be received in writing prior to close of entries. Move-up must be made on or before Monday, May 1, 2023 6:00 PM CST.

Illegible or incomplete entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Entries not accompanied by the correct fees, or a returned check, or a postdated check do not constitute a valid entry. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused or barred from competition by action of the Trial Committee, or because the dog is ineligible to compete due to being entered incorrectly. **Bitches in season** will not be admitted to the trial. Any exhibitor with an entered bitch in season, on the trial date, will be refunded all but \$5 per day of the entry fee. DAAO will also partially refund entry fees (minus an administration fee that will also include recording and judges fee) of any dog that has become injured or ill after the closing date of the trial and cannot compete. To receive all refunds, the trial secretary must receive written notification **prior to the start of the trial each day, and the exhibitor must provide a veterinarian certificate to the club within seven days of the trial.**

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION AND RULE CHANGES

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. For example, the same dog may now be entered in Regular FAST and/or T2B to finish up those titles while also entered in Preferred Master STD/JWW to start working towards their PACH at the lower height. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed.

Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

When calculating entry fees, treat multiple entry forms for the same dog as if only one form had been filled out. In other words, the 1st run entry fee is only paid once per day, per dog, even if that dog's runs have been submitted on multiple entry forms.

Entering for Exhibition Only (FEO)

FEO allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is only offered in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- <u>FEO runs are treated as trial entries.</u> The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. **FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show (must announce "FEO" to both the judge and scribe when entering ring).**
- <u>Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs</u>. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- •<u>Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master).</u> If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- •The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- <u>Toys are allowed in the ring</u>. Toys must be non-audible and may not leave the handler's hand. Toys that roll freely may not be used.
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring.
- <u>FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction</u>. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time.

Fix and Go

Fix and Go On allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using Fix and Go On will result in a non-qualifying score. Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the run.

COURSE WALK THROUGHS AND WARM UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only and will be split as needed to minimize the number of handlers in each walk-through group. Further details will be in the final confirmation.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog.

Measuring and Height Card Information

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete. As of March 1, 2021, if a VMO or Agility Field Representative is measuring dogs at a trial, all present and entered dogs without a valid measurement must be measured.

Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs to Be Measured List.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete.

Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes. Dogs should be physically sound.

Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible and neither are aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under four months of age are strictly prohibited from the trial grounds.

After the close of entries, a dog, which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler, may be moved to the Novice "B" class. A request must be submitted to the trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of EACH trial and must state the reason and justification for the move. A dog may be moved down in their class level (i.e., Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial. (Chapter 1 Section 21) After the close of entries, a dog, which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler, may be moved to the Novice "B" class. A request must be submitted to the trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of EACH trial and must state the reason and justification for the move. A dog may be moved down in their class level (i.e., Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial. (Chapter 1 Section 21)

A MACH or PACH rosette and decorated MACH or PACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain either a MACH or PACH title at these trials. Any dog completing an AGCH at our trial will be awarded a personalized director's chair, rosette and AGCH bar to commemorate the accomplishment. A new title award will be awarded to any dog finishing a title at these trials. Dogs qualifying in both Master Standard and Master JWW at the same trial will receive a "Double-Q" award. Dogs Qualifying in Master FAST, Master JWW, and Master Standard will be awarded a "Triple-Q" ribbon.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Dog Agility Association of the Ozarks and its agents, employees etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Dog Agility Association of the Ozarks reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Dog Agility Association of the Ozarks, or any official thereof.

Dog Agility Association of the Ozarks will not be responsible for the loss of/or damage to any dog entered and exhibited, whether the result of accident or other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this trial is under the care, custody, and control of its owner or handler at all times. **The Dog Agility Association of the Ozarks**, Club officers and board members assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by the exhibitors, their dogs, or property.

All dogs must be on leash at all times or otherwise confined when on trial/show grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds. the exhibitors, their dogs, or property.

IMPORTANT EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

Due to regulations of the Springfield-Greene County Park Board, all exhibitors will need to sign the Valley Water Mill Park Equine Liability Waiver upon arrival at the trial site and prior to running your dogs. These are available at the trial site all three days.

PLEASE DO NOT ENTER THE ARENA OR SET UP until Thursday, May 4, 2023 at 5 PM (set up is 5 - 7 PM).

Please set your crates up in the designated marked areas ONLY. NO ex-pens and please stack your crates, especially if you have unentered dogs. No one can set up in the arena until after the agility ring setup is completed and the crating space is marked. Please bring mats or tarps to place under crates on the arena floor. Crates may be left overnight but DAAO and VWMEC will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

We will be using the Agility Gate app to facilitate easy check in and to allow exhibitors to follow the class running order/trial progression remotely during the trial day. Course maps will be available daily on the app, and they will also be hung at the trial site. A limited number of paper copies will be available at the trial each day.

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only.

Please do not touch any of the equipment during the walk throughs - thank you!

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. A copy of these regulations are available at https://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/REAGIL.pdf

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging. Dogs that need to be measured must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. They will adhere as closely as possible to the judging schedule. The owner or handler of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. Neither the club nor the Trial Secretary have any obligation or responsibility to provide a service through a public address system, or stewards, or runners, for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

Running Order Conflicts: The trial secretary will make every effort to minimize running order conflicts for a handler running two or more dogs in the same class and height, or in adjacent heights. On the day of a trial, if a handler feels more separation is needed, the club will make every effort to accommodate the request. When more separation is requested, per AKC rule, the judge must be asked to grant the change. The trial chair or gate steward may make the request on the handler's behalf. There are likely very few instances where the request will not be granted. Please note that, also per AKC rule, the second dog may be moved down in the order, but the first dog may not be moved up. Out of consideration for affected competitors, the scribe and the scorer, the club asks that all running order change requests be made no later than before the start of the briefing for the class in question.

**THE FAST CLASSES will walk and run all levels combined as one class by jump height. Please consult the AKC Regulations for Agility Trials for a complete description and eligibility for entry into these classes. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/height divisions. Dogs running in a lower height division than they are eligible for will be eliminated.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.
